## **Course Tour and Tips**

**Hole 1** – Use the tee area on the Pro Shop side of the lake on this straight Par 5. Aim for the center line and compete for a prize. There's a drop zone across the lake.

**Hole 2** – Beware the sand trap in front of the green and the yards on the left of this Par 3 hole. Please rake the bunker.

**Hole 3** - This dogleg left Par 5 is the hardest hole on the course. Out of bounds is on the left. If your ball lands in the water, the drop zone is on the green side of the lake.

**Hole 4** - Another dogleg around the trees. Out of bounds is on the left. Water ball? The drop zone is across the creek.

**Hole 5** - It's a tight squeeze through the trees. Hit the green and compete for a prize. Lost or unplayable ball? The drop zone is across the creek.

**Hole 6** - Another dogleg right. It's out of bounds if your ball lands right into Fairway 9. This is your third Par 5.

**Hole 7** - Aim your approach shot a bit short so it rolls onto the green, which slopes sharply toward the street.

**Hole 8** – Hit your ball past the trees. A good second shot could put you on the green in 2 for a one-putt birdie.

**Hole 9** – This is your last dogleg, so be careful with out of bounds on the left **and** right.

## **Course Tour and Tips**

- Take one penalty stroke if your ball is unplayable, such as under a tree/bush or next to a tree trunk.

#### Out of bounds balls:

- If your ball lands out of bounds on holes 3, 4, 6, 8 or 9 beyond the white fairway boundary stakes and onto an adjacent fairway, in the woods, a yard or the road, <u>one penalty stroke</u> must be assessed. This rule also applies to failed attempts to "cut the corner" on holes 3, 6 and 9. This rule is for the safety of golfers who may be playing on adjacent fairways.
