Weekly League Procedures

- Arrive at Twin Woods around 3:30 p.m. Expect a line in the Pro Shop and a full parking lot.
- The bag drop will be on the wall of the equipment shed behind the Pro Shop.
- If you plan to stay for the after-golf social, park next to the fence as shown on this parking diagram: https://bucksmontgolf.org/LeagueParking.pdf
- Pay your green fee (\$20) and put a check by your name on the sign in sheet in the Pro Shop.
- If you want a riding cart (\$8), you'll be given a cart number and key in the Pro Shop. The carts will be lined up on Betty's lawn.
- Go to the league's table in the Gazebo, sign in to participate in the optional prize contest (\$5) and buy your 50-50 tickets (\$5 each).
- The starting-hole chart for April and May will be posted outside the Gazebo. You can see which hole you'll start on here: https://bucksmontgolf.org/Groupings.pdf. We expect no more than 60 of our 70 members will come to play.
- We'll stream out to our starting holes no later than 4 p.m. Divide into no more than two groups when you reach your tee area.
- Everyone must use the forward "red" tee areas on Holes 2-9 and the tee area on Hole #1 that is on the Pro Shop side of the lake.
- Use the painted drop zone circle at the start of the fairway if your drive splashes into the lake.
- The two on-course contests will be on fairway #1 and green #5. Write your name and distance on the placards if your ball is closer to the painted line on fairway #1 or the hole on green #5 than anyone else who is playing ahead of you.

- We'll use your final 2024 handicap
 (https://bucksmontgolf.org/Statistics24.pdf) to determine your net score for your first three contest rounds. Handicaps for new league members will be the average men's and women's 2024 league handicaps until they play their third rounds this year.
- Maintaining a steady pace of play is important, so check out and follow these playing procedures: https://bucksmontgolf.org/rules.pdf
- Please play "ready golf" so you can finish your round before 6:15 p.m. If nobody is in front of you on a fairway, go ahead and hit your ball. Your maximum number of stokes on any hole should be double par. If a group is waiting to tee off on the par 3 holes, wave them up so they can hit their drives before you finish putting.
- In case of an emergency on the course, call 911. Then call our fellow golfer, first-responder Tom Sowinski, who has volunteered to help until an ambulance arrives. You may want to go ahead now and put his number in your contacts list: (302) 547-1826.
- If your group is still playing at 6:15, finish that hole and put a bogey score on your scorecard for any unfinished holes.
- Turn in your scorecard BEFORE you put your clubs away. There will be a basket for scorecards on the table in the picnic area.
- Return your riding cart to the Pro Shop BEFORE heading to the aftergolf social in the picnic area.
- We hope you'll stay for the social, where we'll award the 50-50 prize and the weekly prizes for low-net scores and on-course contests.
- Alcoholic drinks are \$2. Other drinks and snacks are \$1.
- Six prizes will be awarded at the after-golf hangout most weeks.
 They are:
 - The golfer whose drive is closest to the center line on fairway #1 will win 15% of the prize pool.
 - The drive on the Par 3 #5 that is closest to the hole will also win 15% of the prize money.

-	Those with the four low-net scores will win 25%, 20%, 15% and 10% of the pool. Low-net scores are the actual score minus the member's handicap.
